The hymns performed by today's trio are both popular traditional hymns. "In the Garden" was written in 1912 by a layman who was inspired while reading the story of Jesus and Mary in the 20th chapter of the Gospel of John. It speaks of our personal connection to God and the sweetness of our walk with him. It has been recorded on numerous record albums by artists such as Elvis Presley, Anne Murray, Willie Nelson, and Alan Jackson.

"Amazing Grace" was written in the 18th century by Englishman John Newton who was involved in the slave trade until he was converted to Christianity and became a clergyman and abolitionist. The hymn's message of forgiveness and redemption resonates as strongly today as it did over 200 years ago, which has made it one of the most famous hymns of all time.


